POSITION: Head of Staging/Flys

CATEGORY: Permanent 38 Hours per week

POSITION OBJECTIVES:

1. To assist in the planning, rostering and realisation of the requirements of incoming shows with a particular focus on Staging/Flys.

- 2. To assist in the operation of all technical aspects pertaining to the use of the stage, fly system and associated theatrical effects. To ensure all rigging and flying activity is completed efficiently and safely.
- 3. To coordinate and attend to maintenance and adjustments to the theatre equipment to ensure the venues operate effectively as performing arts venues, are well presented to the public and comply with the relevant statutory requirements.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

Objective 1

- To work with the Production and Technical Manager to ensure that the company's technical department is running safely and professionally at the highest possible standard, and that all staff understand and adhere to company policies and procedures.
- To liaise with incoming production companies as required, to evaluate the set and lighting
 design for rigging requirements, and provide a high level of customer service to users of the
 centre.
- To ensure the efficient use of company time by casual employees in the production department and to participate in meetings as required.
- To assist venue hirers to realise their technical needs within the limits of the venues capabilities.
- Be able to retrieve data from the event management system, program various building amenities (such as air conditioning and security systems) and adjust rosters where required.

Objective 2

- To safely and efficiently set-up, maintain and operate stage machinery.
- To understand the very high degree of safety and attention to detail required when rigging and planning to rig a production.
- Participate in, and lead where necessary, the bump-in and bump-out of productions and events.
- To act as Supervisor when required.
- To lead event crew on the floor to realise the requirements of productions and maintenance.
